CRITERIA FOR PARTICIPANTS

- Obligation to possess the EU Covid-19 Certificate (Green pass)
 - To check the Green Pass for participants, an information event will be organised at least one week before the exchange.
 - All the collected data will be treated according to the GDPR.
- Respect the various measures in place for travellers of the hosting country (<https://reopen.europa.eu/en/>)
- Pupils should be able to host partners in families
- If needed new selection of working groups due to the adapted Covid-19 participation criteria
- Thinking about the possibility to take out an additional risk insurance to cover cancellation fees due to the pandemic.

PRODUCT & PROJECT OUTCOMES

- Due to reschedule of activities - Quality before quantity
- Participating institutions will concentrate their efforts first on the topics of the exchanges they will attend in presence
- The type of products/outcomes will remain unchanged, according to the application and the agreement signed during the 1st JSTE in Larnaca (November 2019)
- Developed products/outcomes should be exchanged with all partners using digital media (especially eTwinning, project common Cloud) and should be disseminated on the dedicated platforms.

PRODUCT & PROJECT OUTCOMES

- A project logo and acronym;
- A project website, containing all project activities/outcomes;
- An eTwinning account, containing all project activities/outcomes;
- An Erasmus+ Corner inside each respective partner school, containing all information for the whole school community;
- A Facebook-Page, containing all project activities/outcomes;
- Various OER lesson plans and other digital learning materials (power point presentations, portfolios, brochures, booklets, videos, pictures, etc.) that promote innovative pedagogies and methods for teaching, learning and assessment and that support educators and learners to use digital technologies in creative, collaborative and efficient ways;

PRODUCT & PROJECT OUTCOMES

- A YouTube Channel, containing all project videos;
- A guidebook compiled by students for students and young people, whose aim is to explain how to use in classrooms the actions (SELFIE self-reflection tool) suggested by the European Framework for Digitally Competent Educational Organisation and the Digital Education Action Plan;
- A manual for educators. The booklet will be compiled during each short-term joint staff training event and will be published at the end of the project. It will consist in a compilation of education tools in the field of digitization at school and will bring together the various strands of the project through the years, the working techniques, instructions and examples on how to work with students on the project topic, the list of local partners holding workshops, lectures, etc. while at the same time reporting on the conclusions reached by students and necessary measures to take to support innovation in education systems and the needs of the labour market.
